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Home Safety Checklist

Make your family safer, step-by-step with these helpful reminders.

- Sound the Alarm: Install smoke detectors on every floor of your home and carbon monoxide detectors near sleeping areas. If already installed, test them!
- HOME
- Avoid Overload: Check for overloaded extension cords—usage should not exceed the recommended wattage.
- Don't Get Tippy: If young children are in the home, bookshelves and other furniture should be firmly secured with wall brackets to prevent
- Watch Cord Placement: Extension cords should not be placed under rugs or heavy furniture, tacked up or coiled while in use.
- Get Grounded: All major appliances should be grounded. Be sure to check your ground fault circuit interrupters regularly.
- Plan Your Escape: Practice a fire escape plan with your family where you identify two exits for every room and what to do with young children.
- Keep Extinguishers Handy: Place allpurpose fire extinguishers in key locations in your home—the kitchen, bedroom and garage. Be sure to check expiration dates regularly and know how to use them safely.
- Cool Your Jets: Set your water heater below 120 degrees Fahrenheit to avoid potential burns and to save energy.

Water-wise Tips for Late Summer Water Savings

Water is essential to our everyday lives. And, our supplies are limited so please use water wisely. Cutting water use inside and outside our homes is really important. If each of us changed our water-use habits, we could save billions of gallons of water. Here's how you can help:

Indoor

- Wash only full loads of laundry and dishes: Saves up to 50 gallons per week.
- Fix household leaks promptly: Saves up to 20 gallons per day.

- Spend only 5 minutes in the shower: Saves up to 8 gallons each time.
- Turn off the water while you brush your teeth: Saves up to 2.5 gallons per minute.

- Water your lawn 1 to 2 days a week instead of 5 days a week: Saves up to 840 gallons per
- Check your sprinkler system for leaks, overspray and broken sprinkler heads and repair promptly: Saves up to 500 gallons per month.
- Water your plants in the early morning or
- evening to reduce evaporation and ineffective watering due to wind: Saves up to 25 gallons each time.
- Mulch! Save hundreds of gallons a year by using organic mulch around plants to reduce evaporation.

Melon Chicken Salad

The combination of sweet honey, salty soy sauce, tart vinegar, bitter daikon radish, and savory chicken make this inspired chicken salad one for the repeat recipe file.

Ingredients

1/4 cup rice vinegar

2 tablespoons low-sodium soy sauce

2 tablespoons chunky peanut butter

1 tablespoon honey

3/4 teaspoon dark sesame oil

3 cups (2 x 1/4-inch) strips honeydew melon

3 cups (2 x 1/4-inch) strips cantaloupe

2 cups (2 x 1/4-inch) strips daikon radish

1 cup (2 x 1/4-inch) strips peeled English cucumber

3 tablespoons thinly sliced green onions

2 cups shredded cooked chicken breast

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro

2 tablespoons chopped walnuts, toasted

Preparation

Combine first 5 ingredients in a large bowl, stirring well with a whisk. Add honeydew and next 4 ingredients (through green onions); toss well to coat. Place 2 cups melon mixture on each of 4 plates; top each serving with 1/2 cup chicken. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon cilantro over each serving; top each with 1 1/2 teaspoons walnuts. Serve immediately. Home Sales & Prices Continue To Rise

Sales volume was up: The number of closed house sales in King County in May topped 2,000 for the first time since August 2007 and was up 24% from May 2011. Shoreline had an increase of 30% in the number of sales.

The median price of single-family homes sold in Seattle in May was \$362,000, up 0.6% from April and a more impressive 4.9% from May 2011, according to the NWMLS. For Shoreline the increase was even larger at 9%.



Echo Lake average sale price dipped 2012 YTD from 2011. This is due to the larger number of short sale and foreclosure listings than last year bringing the average sale price down from \$260,000 in 2011 to \$238,000 YTD. There are essentially two markets right now: "Distressed" and "Non–distressed" homes. If you have equity in your home you can still sell at a price better than in recent years. The question is *Will this market continue?* Is this housing recovery a "V" or a "W"?
