

Celebrate Arbor Day—Plant a Tree!

A visit to Nebraska today wouldn't disclose that the state was once a treeless plain. Yet it was the lack of trees there that led to the founding of Arbor Day in the 1800s.

Among pioneers moving into the Nebraska Territory in 1854 was J. Sterling Morton. He and his wife were lovers of nature, and the home they established in Nebraska was quickly planted with trees, shrubs and flowers.

Morton was a journalist and soon became editor of Nebraska's first newspaper – through which he spread agricultural information and his enthusiasm for trees to an equally enthusiastic audience.

His fellow pioneers missed their trees. But more importantly, trees were needed as windbreaks to keep soil from blowing and for fuel and building materials, as well as shade from the hot sun. In 1872, Morton first proposed a tree planting holiday to be called "Arbor Day" at a meeting of the State Board of Agriculture.

It was estimated that more than one million trees were planted in Nebraska on the first Arbor Day.

In 1970, President Nixon proclaimed the last Friday in April as National Arbor Day. Today all 50 states celebrate Arbor Day, although the dates vary in keeping with the local climate. For the homeowner, Arbor Day is an excellent opportunity to take stock of the trees on your property and plan for the future.



What can you do?

- Inspect your trees. Note any broken branches or evidence of disease or insect infestation.
- Fertilize trees and shrubs for healthy spring growth.
- Think about how planting new trees might improve the look of your property or provide wind or heat protection.
- Take a trip to your local nursery to see what's available and to get new ideas.
- And, oh yes, plant a tree. Plant trees or shrubs to shade your air conditioning unit, but be careful not to block the airflow. A unit operating in the shade uses less electricity.
